TRIENNIAL REPORT 2015-2018

1. Introduction

The Network for Astronomy School Education, NASE, organizes courses for secondary and primary school teachers in different continents. The courses are given in the language of the country, and all the material is translated. A small group of two or three members of NASE visits the country and teaches the course in cooperation with local IAU members in the country (if there are any) and any teachers interested in astronomy. These people form a new local NASE working group and they repeat the course at least once per year. Of course, they are invited to cooperate with NASE in other courses and in the creation of materials. The local NASE working group cooperates with local institutions, e.g. the Ministry of Education, Universities and/or Observatories, Teachers Associations. The educational resources and course materials are in several languages: English, Spanish, Portuguese, Chinese Mandarin, Romanian, Indonesian, French and we are translating into other languages. The basic course is the same in all countries, except for the respective changes on latitude and longitude. Every course includes a special sessions on Cultural Astronomy and Astronomy in the City in order to showcase the uniqueness of each site. This part is prepared by local astronomers in cooperation with archeastronomy members of the IAU. Other monographic courses were created. 2. Closing remarks

NASE obtained certification in the IRAM-ISO 29990-2013 standards in Argentina in 2016, which concern "Learning services for non-formal education and training and basic requirements for learning service providers (LSP), in order to achieve compliance with certain goals and achieve concrete results that comply with an applicable standard worldwide. This certification must be obtained for each country. In this way Argentina is opening a way to the establishment of certification in other countries, although NASE can not establish this certification for all member countries because of the financial investment that this represents. All countries that are part of NASE are governed by the

same dynamics and structures, but to certify the quality standards, the chair of NASE has decided to certify first in the country where the program NASE is more widespread and where they have developed more courses (19 courses in the past 7 years), namely Argentina. In spite of that, the documentation can be very easily extended to other countries after changing a few specific details, and now is available in English, thanks to help from NASE-Honduras.
