1. THE IAU PUBLISHER

The official IAU publisher is Cambridge University Press (CUP).

all as hard back volumes and on-line.

The IAU continues to aim for a high quality and timely Proceedings Series. Published IAU Proceedings of all IAU Colloquia and Symposia are available at

with free access for 2010 IAU Proceedings.

On-line access from CUP is for 18 months, after which the contents of Highlights of Astronomy Volume 16 will be transferred to the ADS.

2. DEADLINES FOR "HIGHLIGHTS" MANUSCRIPTS

In the contract between the IAU and CUP, it is stipulated that the Proceedings of IAU meetings will be published within six months after the event. Since CUP needs three months for its processing of a complete Proceedings manuscript, the Contact Editors and the General Secretary have the first three months after the Joint Discussions and Special Sessions to complete the editing task for each paper.

To ensure publication of the volume by March 2013, the following deadlines must be met:

- first submission by Authors to the Contact Editors of JD and SpS: September 30 or earlier
- final, corrected contributions sent by Contact Editors to the General Secretary: November 30
- reply to queries, corrections, etc. by the GS: December 31 -ABSOLUTE DEADLINE!

IN SHORT: THE DEADLINE FOR AUTHORS FOR SUBMITTING PAPERS TO THE CONTACT EDITOR OF EACH JD OR SpS IS: no later than END SEPTEMBER 2012.

CONTACT EDITORS MUST, IN TURN, SUBMIT THEIR MANUSCRIPTS TO THE GENERAL SECRETARY NO LATER THAN END NOVEMBER 2012. THIS ALLOWS ANY QUERIES TO BE RESOLVED BEFORE THE ABSOLUTE DEADLINE OF END DECEMBER 2012.

Please realize that a typical "Highlights" volume contains 800 pages or more ! So keeping rigorously with the above deadlines is mandatory to help the Editor-in-Chief assemble the volume and ensure a timely publication by CUP.

4. AUTHORS: STYLE FILE FOR PREPARING YOUR MANUSCRIPT AND SUBMISSION

The author's style file is < iau-JDSS.cls >. Its latest version is also available at on the IAU web site http://www.iau.org/static/scientific_meetings/authors_proceedings/>.

It is not allowed to change font sizes and layout. The IAU wishes to have a fixed appearance of its Proceedings. For figures, authors are free to include their preferred packages (e.g., epsf).

CUP does not require that each paper has to start with an odd page number, and/or has an even number of pages.

All AUTHORS are requested to submit their manuscript(s), in electronic form (all LaTeX files, figure files) and a paper copy in .pdf, to the CONTACT EDITOR of their Joint Discussion or Special Session. The deadline for submitting manuscripts is September 30, 2012.

5. EDITORS: OUTLINE OF YOUR JD / SpS MANUSCRIPT

The Author Index is mandatory for each JD or SpS. This is essential to help the Editor-in-Chief assemble later a global Author Index at the end of the volume.

Contact Editors are free, within reason, to use (parts of) their pages for illustrative photographs and other artwork representative of their IAU meeting, subject to the conditions given in Sect. 8 below.

6. REFEREEING NOT MANDATORY

The IAU does not require that manuscripts of individual papers for the Highlights have to be refereed. But, of course, Contact Editors are free to do so if they wish, e.g., with the help of their SOC as referees, as long as this does not delay the publication of their Proceedings in Highlights.

7. PAGE ALLOCATION PER MANUSCRIPT

The maximum number of pages for each JD and SpS is given in the following table:

HIGHLIGHTS OF ASTRONOMY VOLUME 16 maximum number of pages - mandatory

Invited Discourse	15 pages
1.0-day Joint Discussion	20 pages
1.5-day Joint Discussion	30 pages
0.5-day Special Session	10 pages
1.0-day Special Session	20 pages
1.5-day Special Session	30 pages
2.0-day Special Session	40 pages
2.5-day Special Session	50 pages
3.0-day Special Session	60 pages

These maximum numbers of pages do NOT include the Table of Contents (ToC), and the Author Index (AI) for each meeting. Those will have to be provided to the Editor-in-Chief, and will be merged in the global ToC and AI for the whole Highlights volume.

It is up to the Contact Editor(s) how to allocate the number of pages per article within their Joint Discussion or Special Session within the stated limits. As an example, editors should see Highlights of Astronomy Vol. 15, Ed. lan Corbett, CUP 2010, ISBN 1743-9213. (see link in p.1).

8. COLOUR FIGURES and PHOTOGRAPHS

There will be no charge for colour figures embedded in the LaTeX files of papers. Colour figures will be reproduced in colour in the electronic version of the Highlights volume. However, to reproduce colour figures in colour in the printed version is an expensive process, and CUP will charge the authors 500.pounds sterling (GBP) per colour page. If authors are not prepared to pay for this, their colour figures will be printed in black-and-white in the printed version of the Proceedings. Therefore, in case of colour figures with half-tones, authors should make sure beforehand that their figures will reproduce as desired in black-and-white, and that there is no reference to colour in either text or captions.

Unless directly related to the subject matter of the contribution concerned, only a very limited number of photographs can be included in the Highlights, at the discretion of the Contact Editors. This number may however be reconsidered by the Editor-in-Chief together with the Contact Editors, if the total number of photographs for the volume is excessive.
